

MAGNIFICENT MENDELSSOHN

Gade Echoes of Ossian Mendelssohn Violin Concerto Bruckner Symphony No.4 'Romantic'

The poems attributed to the Gaelic warrior-bard Ossian were staples of the early Romantic movement. One of many in their thrall was Giordano Bellincampi's compatriot, Niels Gade, who wrote an overture which made its 23-year-old composer famous overnight.

Gade's admirers included Mendelssohn, whose much-loved concerto will be the APO début of another brilliant young musician, New Zealand-born violinist Geneva Lewis.

None of Bruckner's monumental symphonies has a specific programme, but the Fourth is the only one to which he gave a title. A fitting one, too. It is music that evokes German forests, chivalrous deeds and grand heroism.

DVOŘÁK CELLO CONCERTO

Lutosławski Concerto for Orchestra

George Walker's affecting tribute to his grandmother, an escaped slave, is his most popular work. It's elegiac, yet gently suffused with optimism.

Dvořák would have appreciated it. He wrote his glorious Cello Concerto when he was living in the United States, where he was captivated by the traditional music he encountered and predicted great things of African-American composers.

Lutosławski's Concerto is a piece to show off a virtuoso orchestra and gives individual musicians a moment to shine. To lead it, Shiyeon Sung, the first woman to win the Sir Georg Solti International Conductors' Competition, in her first appearance with the APO.

Kodály *Háry János*: Suite **Jenő Lisztes** Improvisation for Cimbalom

John Adams Scheherazade.2

A concert of storytelling. Kodály's operetta concerns the heroic adventures of a Hungarian peasant... and if Háry János perhaps exaggerates a bit (did he *really* capture Napoleon single-handedly?), then what's wrong with that?

Central to the piece is the sound of the cimbalom, the Hungarian zither. It's a notoriously difficult instrument and Jenő Lisztes' virtuosity is totally breathtaking.

Inspired by the Tales of the 1001 Nights, John Adams riffed on Rimsky-Korsakov in a 'dramatic symphony' for violin and orchestra about 'a Scheherazade in our own time', ending with 'escape, flight, and sanctuary' from the barbaric men subjugating her.

Ravel La valse

The APO's own Ingrid Bauer takes centre stage in a champagne programme with a hint of cabaret.

'Le boeuf sur le toit' is now a fancy Paris restaurant, but in the Roaring Twenties it was an artists' bar, lifting its name from Milhaud's cheerful ballet. He was a regular, as was Tailleferre. Her sparkling concertino shares the bill with Debussy's miniature masterpiece, which far transcends its origins as a demonstration work for a new type of harp.

Satie's placid *Gymnopédies* are followed by Ravel's very French take on the Viennese waltz, and the evening's *divertissement* begins with a rarely heard tone-poem by Saint-Saëns. *Santé!*

TOTALLY TRUMPET

Aleksandra Pakhmutova Concerto for Trumpet and Orchestra Penderecki Trumpet Concertino Rachmaninov Symphony No.2

Outstanding Norwegian trumpet phenomenon Tine Thing Helseth joins the APO for the first time to play two little-known but dazzling pieces.

Penderecki's hugely entertaining Concertino includes a flugelhorn and a contralto trumpet which effortlessly evokes nostalgic, late-night jazz.

The Russian composer Aleksandra Pakhmutova wrote her Concerto in 1955, but it only took off in the West in the late 1970s. Her music is direct and tuneful, in the best Russian tradition, and it's a terrific pairing with the profusion of melody in Rachmaninov's sprawling, life-affirming symphony.

RUSSIAN MAGIC

Sofia Gubaidulina Fairytale Poem Shostakovich Cello Concerto No.2 Tchaikovsky Symphony No.4

'Fate, that ominous power... There is no alternative but to submit to Fate.' So Tchaikovsky wrote, and so his symphony unfolds. Fate is represented by the implacable brass fanfare which begins the piece and which at crucial moments crashes into Tchaikovsky's passionate outpouring of emotion.

Sofia Gubaidulina's piece illustrates a fairy tale about a small piece of chalk that dreams of drawing flowers and trees, but is forced to draw 'boring words, numbers, and geometric figures on the blackboard'.

Another Russian composer persecuted by Fate was Shostakovich, who looked inward in this darkly glittering concerto.

Brahms' last symphony – with its autumnal nostalgia, its solemn beauty, its rough humour, its homage to the old music he loved so much – was in many ways the apotheosis of his career. It is a mighty work, and a performance with Giordano Bellincampi conducting the APO promises to be a very special occasion.

So too is an appearance by the wonderful French pianist Jean-Efflam Bavouzet, making a welcome return with Bartók's hard-driving, boisterous concerto.

Stravinsky's brief but heartfelt tribute to Debussy, whom he revered, started as a piano chorale. Considered one of the major 20th century works for wind ensembles, the music emerges in clearly defined segments, each showcasing a different set of winds.

A fond welcome back to a member of the APO family, Tianyi Lu – another winner of the Sir Georg Solti International Conductors' Competition.

Salina Fisher's imagination was fired by the famous 'Chart of Islands' drawn by Tupaia, the Polynesian master navigator, while he was sailing with James Cook on the *Endeavour*.

The prodigiously talented French composer Lili Boulanger died, tragically, at only 24, but left behind this diptych: a fresh and breezy celebration of spring, and the much more introspective work which was to be her last.

Spanish pianist Javier Perianes joins us for Falla's gorgeous nocturnal study, and Stravinsky's sumptuous fairytale ballet rounds off the evening.

GROSVENOR PLAYS GRIEG

Thomas Adès Three-piece Suite from *Powder Her Face* Grieg Piano Concerto Walton Symphony No.1

Two *enfants terribles* frame Grieg's evergreen concerto, played by the marvellous British pianist Benjamin Grosvenor.

In his sensational 1995 opera, *Powder Her Face*, the 24-year-old Thomas Adès cast a sardonic eye over the sexual hypocrisy of the British upper classes. This exuberant suite is Adès' version of thirties popular music, with a large helping of tango, seen through a diamond-hard lens.

Sixty years earlier, the 'bright young thing' of English music was William Walton. His first symphony is breathless, loud, and exhilarating. Fast-rising British conductor Alpesh Chauhan leads the APO in a cracker of a programme.

It is very exciting that New Zealand composer Gemma Peacocke, currently making a name for herself in New York, is writing a new work for us. It will be followed by one of Mozart's most ebullient piano concertos.

Martinů quotes his own music in his last symphony, and he occasionally implied there was a programme behind it. If so, it remains a mystery, as he was fairly oblique on the subject. What is unambiguous, though, is that this is a superb piece, with shadowy music giving way to exultant, rhapsodic song. If you're yet to hear it, you've a real treat in store.

Strauss does more than merely depict a day climbing a mountain. He convinces us that we are there. Strolling through alpine meadows, scrabbling up the rockface, standing at the summit. And you'll be rummaging urgently for your raincoat when the storm breaks. This tremendous piece needs a gigantic orchestra and Giordano Bellincampi and the APO are joined by members of the Australian National Academy of Music (ANAM) to help reach the summit.

'Lontano' is a musical term meaning 'play as if from a distance', and Ligeti's magical piece comes from other worlds. Bach's suite is earthbound in the best way. It is human and uncomplicatedly joyous.

Beethoven Egmont: Overture Bernstein Serenade Prokofiev Romeo and Juliet (selections)

Uncoiled energy from Beethoven at his most muscular introduces Bernstein's golden Serenade, played by the incomparable violinist James Ehnes. A concerto in all but name, it is best described by its composer: 'a series of statements in praise of love'.

Prokofiev's ballet could be said to be a single statement of the same sentiment. Fleet-footed character pieces, brutal violence, luminous dances of helpless love: it's a searing retelling of the story of the star-crossed lovers, and a magnificent showpiece for the orchestra to round off the season.

Dvořák Slavonic Dances (selections)

We continue our journey with Giordano Bellincampi through the music of Nielsen, with Jonathan Cohen, the APO's Principal Clarinet. Nielsen wanted to explore the instrument's soul, which he conceived as being complex and wide-ranging – 'at once gentle as balm and screaming as a streetcar on poorly lubricated rails'.

The symphony Mozart composed for Prague is the greatest he had yet written. It is a piece whose ideas seem to burst out of it, and a fitting companion to the helter-skelter overture to his Turkish comedy.

A selection of Dvořák's infectiously high-spirited Slavonic Dances will have us polka-ing out of the Town Hall.

The astonishing violinist Christian Li signed a recording contract with the prestigious Decca label two years ago. He was twelve years old at the time. When he plays these showstoppers by Saint-Saëns and Ravel, you'll understand why. To say his musicality is beyond his years is an understatement.

Fauré's music for Maeterlinck's play is best known for the wistful Sicilienne, and the rest of the suite is tender and moving.

Mussorgsky's gleefully diabolical picture of a Black Sabbath introduces Borodin's whirlwind symphony, a splendid wash of Russian colour and spectacle.

Verdi Requiem

'Opera in ecclesiastical dress', sniffed one of Verdi's contemporaries, completely missing the point. A better assessment from a Verdi biographer: the Requiem is 'his genius at its most concentrated'.

Having composed 26 operas, once liberated from the requirements of plot and character, Verdi poured into the Requiem everything he knew about music.

Judgement Day, with trumpets calling across the void, was never more terrifying. And the sacred liturgy is clothed in unforgettable melodies.

Verdi's Requiem calls for a quartet of exceptional soloists, a massive chorus of singers and an orchestra capable of overpowering grandeur. This will be one of the most significant musical events of the year.

Vaughan Williams and his student Douglas Lilburn both deeply admired Sibelius, whose influence is clear in the lean, taut argument of Lilburn's last orchestral work. Sibelius' suite about the legendary hero Lemminkäinen is most familiar for its movement The Swan of Tuonela. In Finnish mythology, Tuonela is the River of Death, and Sibelius gives the calm anguish of the Swan's song to a cor anglais. Chopin's music truly blossoms with the most poetic of pianists, and anyone who's heard Ingrid Fliter with the APO will agree

The great Caruso once observed that all you need for a performance is 'the four best singers in the world', and ours are regulars at top European opera houses. He might also have added that the piece needs a conductor with an infallible theatrical touch. Giordano Bellincampi is the perfect musician for an opera of unstoppable dramatic power.


