A warm welcome to Auckland Philharmonia's 2026 season.


What a superb season we have in store! Outstanding artists joining us for Auckland Philharmonia debuts this year include violinist Gil Shaham, cellist Sheku Kanneh-Mason and conductor Nodoka Okisawa. I am also delighted to welcome back some wonderful friends of the orchestra, including pianist Alexander Gavrylyuk, violinists James Ehnes and Ning Feng, and conductors Elena Schwarz and Karl-Heinz Steffens.

This season of music will transport you to other times, places and worlds, opening with Gavrylyuk playing Rachmaninov's Third Piano Concerto and a dive into Zemlinsky's tone poem, The Mermaid, through to Mahler's Symphony No.1 in November. I'm looking forward to many extraordinary highlights along the way, including

leading our orchestra in Richard Strauss' virtuosic suite, Le Bourgeois Gentilhomme. American violinist Benjamin Beilman also joins us for two unmissable performances, playing concertos by Mendelssohn and Nielsen.

Some wonderful Beethoven works also feature in this season, with a performance of his sublime Violin Concerto, performed by the great Gil Shaham, in June, followed by his spirited Symphony No.2 in July, and concluding with his ever-popular Fourth Piano Concerto in October.

Another highlight for me is our wonderful Concertmaster Andrew Beer and Principal Cello Ashley Brown featured as soloists in Brahms' Double Concerto. Together with Brahms' Academic Festival Overture and Symphony No.4, this will be an evening of sensational and sublime music and magnificent musicianship.

Rachmaninov Piano Concerto No.3 Zemlinsky The Mermaid

Giordano Bellincampi brings us two lush Romantic works to start the season. The titanic 'Rach Three' needs no introduction, nor does a regular visitor to the Auckland Phil, the marvellous Ukrainian-Australian pianist Alexander Gavrylyuk.

Zemlinsky composed his opulent tone poem on the story of the Little Mermaid after a relationship break-up, and his depiction of his heroine's yearning has a terrible poignancy; always inescapable, though, is Zemlinsky's music of the vast, immense sea.

Mendelssohn & Dvořák

Maria Grenfell Hinemoa Mendelssohn Piano Concerto No.1 Dvořák Symphony No.8



The scintillating pianist Andrea Lam is at her best in Mendelssohn's bright, bubbly concerto. Brightness and contentment too in Dvořák's most bucolic symphony – few pieces are so uncomplicatedly happy. It's out-of-doors music by a humble man with simple tastes.

Closer to home, the Māori legend tells of the beautiful maiden Hinemoa who swam across Lake Rotorua to her lover, the warrior Tūtānekai. What inspired Maria Grenfell, though, was that Hinemoa was guided by music – the sound of Tūtānekai's flute.



Boléro

Debussy (orch. Busser) Printemps Michael Norris Violin Concerto 'Sama' Fauré Masques et bergamasques Fauré Pelléas et Mélisande: Sicilienne Rayel Boléro

Composed for local star Amalia Hall, Michael Norris's Sufi-inspired concerto 'tries to capture the sense of two vast realms – the earth and the sky – with the dancers whirling ecstatically between them'.

It is framed by some stunning French music. Debussy's painting of the blossoming of nature, and two contrasting works by Fauré, the jolly Masques et bergamasques and the wistful Sicilienne.

Then, endlessly repeated rhythm, sinuously feline melody, imperceptible but implacable crescendo: it can only be Ravel's Boléro.

Brigid Ursula Bisley Illumination Shostakovich Piano Concerto No.1 Mendelssohn A Midsummer Night's Dream (selections) Mendelssohn, unbelievably, was just 17 when he wrote his magical Overture to A Midsummer Night's Dream. Years later, he recaptured the fairy land in his gossamer music for the entire play.

Auckland's own Sylvia Jiang joins our Principal Trumpet Huw Dann for Shostakovich's gleefully crazy concerto. It's uproarious music from a highspirited young man.

And to open, with undercurrents of darkness, Brigid Ursula Bisley's music is an illumination of distant stars and far horizons.

The stunning Russian-Armenian pianist Eva Gevorgyan makes her NZ debut with the delicate, melancholic concerto of the incomparable poet of the piano, Chopin.

Vasily Kalinnikov's glorious First Symphony is one of the forgotten gems of Russian music: its composer died at only 35, and its profusion of warm-hearted melodies gives a tantalising glimpse of what was lost.

Those who knew and mourned Kalinnikov included Tchaikovsky, who opens the concert with the vigorous Polonaise from his greatest opera.


Beethoven Violin Concerto **Prokofiev** *Cinderella* (selections)

Beethoven's towering concerto stands in Olympian solitude. Its technical challenges test the strongest violinists; its artistic ones expose the soul of the supreme musicians. Gil Shaham, appearing for the first time in New Zealand, is unquestionably such an artist.



Prokofiev saw the heroine of his ballet as more than a fairytale character, calling her 'a real person, feeling, experiencing, and moving among us'. He clothes her in music which, by turns, is sprightly, ebullient, and sweetly full of heartfelt longing.

Gil Shaham's performance is supported by the Auckland Philharmonia Friends and a consortium of dedicated donors.





'Poised and monstrously talented'

young violinist Benjamin Beilman joins the Auckland Philharmonia for what promises to be a definitive performance of the powerful, rugged concerto by Giordano Bellincampi's compatriot, Carl Nielsen.

Studying in London, homesick, Douglas Lilburn wrote a tribute to the isolated farm in the Turakina Valley where he grew up; it's incredible that this was a student work.

Mozart's translucent, sunlit symphony rounds off the programme with weightless elegance.

Sheku Plays Elgar

Ligeti Melodien Elgar Cello Concerto Sibelius Symphony No.5

The sensational British cellist Sheku Kanneh-Mason is one of the biggest stars of the moment, his accolades including BBC Young Musician of the Year and artist in residence at the New York Philharmonic. He makes his New Zealand debut in Elgar's elegy for the England destroyed by the First World War.

It is contrasted with Ligeti's freewheeling kaleidoscope of orchestral colour. Sibelius's heroic Fifth Symphony is crowned with a magnificent theme, emerging as if organically from the music.

The dazzling French composer Guillaume Connesson captures the universe in his Stephen Hawking-inspired work. In its NZ premiere, the three movements evoke the Big Bang, the appearance of the stars, and a supernova.

On the title page of his Third Symphony, Saint-Saëns wrote the words 'with organ': its first appearance is a mood of quiet contemplation, but there's a big bang here, too, when the Auckland Town Hall's mighty instrument is unleashed - an occasion not to be missed.

The brilliant 17-year-old Canadian pianist Sophia Liu makes her Australasian debut with Beethoven's concerto. It begins with the piano ruminating alone but soon broadens out into one of his most genial works.

A fairy enchants a stream so a prince cannot cross it to see his princess; he wins her with a wooden model of himself. When composing this sumptuous ballet, Bartók was having a passionate love affair, which left more than slight traces in the music.

Appearing in Australasia for the first time, Norwegian pianist Christian Ihle Hadland plays the evergreen concerto by his compatriot Grieg.

Strauss's witty music to Molière's comedy is one of those pieces which orchestral musicians love. It's challenging, it's rarely played, and it's utterly charming. Audiences, meanwhile, find themselves falling in love with it too and wondering why it isn't heard more often.

We begin with a hymn to the sun, which Nielsen composed while gazing at the warm Aegean Sea.

Wagner's music is rarely so celestial as in the prelude to his drama of forgiveness and redemption.

Violinist Ning Feng makes a welcome return to the Town Hall stage for Berg's dream-smitten concerto 'in memory of an angel', contemplating nostalgia, tender affection, and rage against fate.

Schubert never visited Italy, although you'd never know it from his cheerful homage to Italian music. More cheer in Beethoven's lithe Second Symphony, with its generous slow movement and breathless finale.

Beginning with the clean tranquillity of Morning, Grieg's first suite from his music to the play Peer Gynt ends in its hero's escape from the terrifying Mountain King.

Shostakovich's darkly glittering concerto is a searching insight into the soul of the cello and into the soul of its composer. It's played by the blazing Russian cellist Anastasia Kobekina, making her New Zealand debut.

Like all Haydn's late symphonies, his 97th is joyful, energetic, and never less than life-affirming.

Two vivid translations of art into music – Martinů's mystical vision of the murals of the Renaissance master is followed by Mussorgsky's memorial to a painter friend. Mussorgsky originally composed it for piano, but Maurice Ravel transformed his rough-hewn original into a spectacular orchestral showpiece.

The trumpet shines in the hands of Austrian Selina Ott, with Haydn's concerto. There's plenty of flash, of course, but in the limpid slow movement Haydn fondly lets it show its sweet, melodic side.



In Puccini, however, it's above all the orchestra which sings with heartbreaking beauty, sophistication and overwhelming power. Auckland Philharmonia's Opera in Concert is one of the must-see events of the season, and with Maestro Giordano Bellincampi caressing this wonderful score it is true luxury casting.






Mānawatia a Matariki

In 2019 Waiata Anthems debuted at No.1 in the NZ Music Charts – the first 100% reo Māori album to do so – and spent 16 weeks in the NZ Top 40.




